An important message from WMYV-TV, MY48: Full power analog TV broadcasts will end on 2/17/09 and analog-only televisions may lose signal being viewed unless viewer takes action. Over-the-air viewing on analog-only televisions will require the use of a converter box. Analog televisions should continue to work for reception of broadcasts from cable and satellite providers and with gaming consoles, VCRs, DVD players and similar products.
